Ms. Simone read comments into the record: Cheshire Fire Department dated April 18, 2018 and Regional Water Authority dated March 26, 2018.

Chief Casner represented the Town of Cheshire for the application to install a generator at the Youth Center. He explained that the Youth Center is a shelter in an emergency situation for 50+ people. The Town applied for a \$30,000 State grant and received this award. The funds will be used to install a permanent generator, 48kw, in an enclosure, with automatic transfer at zero cost to the Town. The high school generator was installed (off the loading dock area) and services the front half of the high school in an emergency. PBC has portable generators that can connect the other school facilities if there is a power outage. The Police and Fire headquarters and Town Hall (critical

infrastructures) have back-up generators. Chief Casner stated the Youth Center generator will be enclosed so noise will not affect the neighboring areas. Generator exercises will be run during the daytime hours to reduce noise levels in the evenings.
