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The application is for a home that is for sale at 1369 Cheshire Street that was originally scheduled to close in January 2021. The home is currently tied into the gravity sewer main on Marks Place and water is provided by a private well. The town has no record of this connection. The application states that the applicant needs the town of Cheshire to recognize the sewer line connection to be able to complete the sale transaction to the contracted buyers (the current owners have owned the property since 2006).

The property is depicted on the 2018 Town of Cheshire Sewer Area map as an area “not recommended for sewer”. However, this parcel has direct frontage to Marks Place and was already connected in 1987.

The application includes a copy of the well drilling permit from November 24<sup>th</sup>, 1986 which indicates that the septic tank system was to be abandoned and a new sewer lateral was to be installed to the gravity sewer main on Marks Place. There is not documentation as to when this work was conducted so January 1<sup>st</sup>, 1987 has been assumed.

CCTV video and dye testing of the lateral was conducted on January 22<sup>nd</sup>, 2021 by Dave Beedle, A&C Connection Inspection. Review of the video indicated that the home is in fact connected to the gravity sewer main on Marks Place via a 4-inch PVC pipe. The connection to the mainline is solid and the pipe is in good condition with some very light root intrusion. There is also a cleanout installed approximately 8-feet from the house.

The application for acknowledgement of this sewer connection is warranted and administrative approval is recommended with the following conditions:

1. Update current GIS mapping and all town data systems to reflect this parcel to be on the Cheshire public sewer system.
2. Update the Cheshire Sewer Service Area Map to show this parcel as “sewered”.
